



*This document can be used by students to explain the “Study Grant for International Learning Experiences Abroad” mobility programme to the potential host institution; it contains all the main information and requirements of the programme.*

### Call details – Study Grant for Learning Experiences Abroad

The Study Grant for International Learning Experiences Abroad is a mobility grant financed by the medical departments of the University of Bologna. The aim of the grant is to promote international mobility for internships and thesis research.

The duration of the internships is between one and six months; students can choose their destination both within and outside the European Union. The grant is **not** tied to European funds nor to the Erasmus+ for Traineeship programme.

As a host institution, you will be asked to define the duration, the starting date and end date, the number of working hours per week and the content of the internship. A tutor will have to supervise the student and fill in the following documents:

- Application document (for application purposes)
- Certificate of arrival and departure
- Learning Agreement (previously approved by the student’s degree programme)
- Transcript

All the documents listed above are provided to the student by the University of Bologna (Campus of Ravenna).

The student is required, in due time, to gather all the necessary information about:

- Any specific requirement and/or administrative procedure required by the host institution (e.g. application, documents to be submitted, etc.);
- Any rules and regulations about entering and staying in the host country, including health-related ones;
- Healthcare access in the host country; candidates may enquire about this at their local Italian National Health Service offices (ASL) or to the relevant Embassies or Consulates of the host country in Italy.

Insurance cover:

- Health insurance: students are covered through the Italian/European national health system for mobilities within the European Union. For mobilities outside the EU, students are required to purchase private Health Insurance.
- Students are covered by accident and third-party insurance (a copy can be provided upon request). The insurance costs are covered by the University of Bologna for:

1. *Accidents in the workplace*: the insurance offered by the University of Bologna covers trainees for accidents while carrying out activities at the host company.
2. *Third Party insurance*: the insurance offered by the University of Bologna covers possible third-party damages caused by the trainee in the fulfilment of the internship’s tasks.
